This addendum was generated to answer the following questions submitted for BID 101237 by the question period deadline of 2/21/23 at 12:00 pm. No other questions pertaining to this bid will be accepted or answered moving forward.

Q1: Would you be able to assist us with a breakdown of shipment volumes by location?

A1: The attached table shows the volume of RMW for calendar year 2022 broken down by month. During 2022, all regulated medical waste (RMW) generated at Avedisian Hall, Fascitelli, CBLS, Beaupre and Peckham Farm were included together in the totals. Potter (Health Services) and the two Providence locations are separated out.

In general terms, 75% of all waste originates from Avedisian, while 25% of waste is from Fascitelli, Peckham Farm, CBLS, and Beaupre. Please refer to the attached spreadsheet for numbers of pickups in our Providence locations.

Stops will be required at Avedisian Hall and Potter Health Services twice a month. A rough estimate of type of waste and approximate number of stops for other buildings are as follows:

- Beaupre-1 stop every six weeks. RMW from Beaupre includes 4.5 cf boxes of biohazardous waste and 31 gal totes.
- Fascitelli-1 stop every six weeks. RMW includes 4.5 cf boxes of biohazardous waste.
- Peckham Farm-1 stop per month. RWM includes 4.5 cf boxes of pathological waste for incineration and 4.5 boxes cf biohazardous waste. Approximately six pathological waste boxes will be generated during lambing season (March-April).
- CBLS-1 stop per month-4.5 cf pathological boxes and 4.5 cf biohazardous waste boxes.
- Providence Shepherd Building, which includes both biotechnology and Icubed labs) -5 stops per yearaverage of six 4.5 cf biohazardous waste boxes and one 31 gallon tote (annually).

The number and type of RMW boxes/totes as well as frequency of pickups for Avedisian Hall, Fascitelli, Peckham Farm, CBLS, and Beaupre is dependent on many contributing factors throughout the year(s), including the number of research grants, the type of research, the number of livestock animals at Peckham Farm, number of staff and students conducting research, and number of boxes generated by the crime lab. The number of boxes to be picked up increases at the end of semesters (around May and December), lambing season (typically April) and decreases during the summer. On occasion, there are lab cleanouts which will also increase number of boxes for disposal. For this reason, the amount of RMW is only an estimate for the purposes of this RFP.

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Also included is a campus map presenting the six pickup locations (circled in green) to show their close proximity to each other.

Q2: The more information we have regarding volumes by building or by location will help us be as aggressive as possible with pricing.

A2: Please refer to the answer to question number 1.

Q3: We are interested in particular with the sites that ship bi-weekly so we can determine how much waste to expect on a regular basis and how we could best price it given the logistics of each stop.

A3: Please refer to the answer to question 1 for sites that ship bi-weekly. With regard to logistics, refer to the map included as an attachment. All locations on the Kingston campus are equipped with an accessible loading dock, with the exception of Peckham Farm, which has ground-level pickup. Additionally, the Providence location also has a freight elevator and a loading dock, located on Clemence Street.

Q4: Would you be able to provide an estimated volume of waste shipping from each location? Number of containers to determine the number of drum spaces that would be taken up on a truck is what we are trying to determine by each location.

A4: Please refer to the answer to question number 1.

Q5: For prevailing wage purposes, will this be considered a public works construction contract?


A5: This contract is not a public works construction contract. RMW is generated from academic and research activities.
