The attention of bidders submitting proposals for the above-referenced project is called to the following Addendum to the Request for Proposals indicated above. The items set forth herein, whether of omission, addition, substitution or other change, are all to be included in, and form a part of the proposed Contract Documents for the work.

Inclusion of this Addendum must be acknowledged in the spaces provided in the document entitled "Request for Proposals 25-029 - Fire Department Medical Waste Removal". Failure to acknowledge any and all addenda in the above specified bid form may be cause for rejection of the bids by the Owner on the grounds that it is not responsive.

This addendum consists of two (2) pages.

Item 1: Questions and Answers

Q1: What are the medical waste generator IDs for each location? In RI, a generator of medical waste needs to have an ID that is unique to their address.

A1: The City maintains medical waste generator licensing, but will not include that information here as it is not expected to have any impact on a potential bid. That information will of course be available after the award is made.

Q2: In the RFP it states: The medical waste generated by the Pawtucket Fire Department primarily consists of syringes, medications & blood soiled materials. Are you comingling those 3 waste streams into one box per month? If yes, I assume all of your waste is going for incineration instead of autoclave?

A2: Yes. All waste is together in one container. The ultimate manner of disposal, once the waste has left the City's property, is left to the vendor's discretion.
